New Businesses

BallardVale welcomes two relatively new additions to the businesses in the center of town --- BallardVale Café and Kismet Wellness Center. BallardVale Café is located between Spinner's Pizza Parlor and Sunday's General Store at 195 Andover Street, across from the train station. Owners Sharron and Paul Tirone opened the café in January 2007. Business owners for many years, the café is their first "food venture". They are open for breakfast, lunch and dinner take-out providing homemade baked goods, sandwiches, salads, soups, main course specials, ice cream, desserts and more. Sharron Tirone recalls that she and her husband wanted to open a coffee shop, and they had a very good feeling about the location when they visited BallardVale. "I also felt nostalgic really because my parents used to own a business right across from the train. This spot felt so right!" The BallardVale Café is a welcome addition to the neighborhood. Kismet Wellness Center is located across the street on the second floor of 204 Andover Street. Owned by Andover residents Bridget and Jon Fletcher, and her parents Helene and Tom Quinlan, the Center offers an array of mind and body fitness programs and services for adults and kids. Adults can take yoga and kickboxing classes. Spa services include a variety of styles of massage, reiki, shiatsu and reflexology. For the kids, Kismet offers martial arts classes, yoga and art classes, movie nights and more. Bridget Fletcher, with a software business background, was looking to open a business that she could feel passionate about. And with four kids, she wanted it to be family-friendly, providing enriching valuable programs for kids and adults. Fletcher remembers falling in love with the space, a renovated former mill building. "It has so much character, and it was sad to see it unoccupied", she recalls. Kismet Wellness Center has been active and lively since its opening in April 2008. Fletcher says she feels fortunate to be in BallardVale, and the neighborhood is fortunate, too. Money to Be Used for Playground

BallardVale Crossing is a residential development built on nearly six acres of onceindustrial land in the center of BallardVale. Although the proposed development is located outside of the BallardVale Historic District boundaries, local developer Willard Perkins worked with the BallardVale Historic District Commission in an effort to build a project that was compatible with the character of the local residential area. Perkins and the Commission agreed that an amount of money made from the sale of some of the units would be put toward much-needed improvements to the playground in BallardVale center. The playground currently has a ball field, an area with playing equipment such as slides and swings, a basketball court and picnic tables.

The BVHD Commission and local landscape architect Chris Huntress are seeking

Block Party 2008


